## Parking outside school

We have, once again, received reports from members of the wider community, including the Police, concerned about parking on the road outside school during the drop off and pick up periods. As we now have a parent car park we would ask that as many parents as possible use this facility. We have also been advised by the police it is perfectly acceptable to park in the new housing estate avoiding the blocking of peoples driveways.

In the interests of safety can we ask that you;

- Park away from the yellow zig zag lines. Yellow zig zag road markings are placed to show that the area must be kept clear to allow an unrestricted view for approaching drivers and riders or children wanting to cross the road. We have been advised by the police that you could be charged with obstruction, and they will be making regular visit to the school to enforce this. We would urge you to keep clear of the zig zags at all times in the interest of our children's safety. It is however illegal to park on the double yellow lines outside the school.



- Avoid three point turns in the road?

It is so gratifying to hear that you believe, as parents, that most people do park responsibly, and we would ask you to continue and use the car park provided. Thank you!

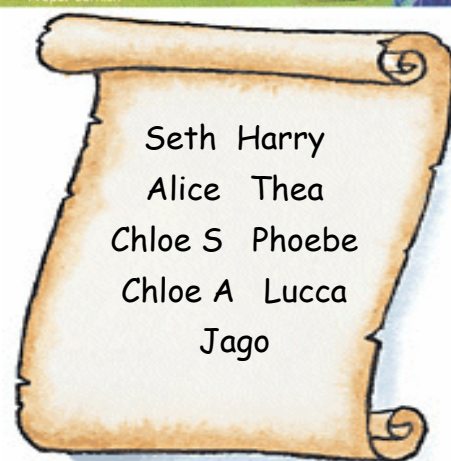
